You can enrol part-time for a Certificate (one year), Diploma (two years), or Master's (three years). The course is validated by Durham University, one of the Russell Group's 24 world-class researchintensive universities.

The aim of St Padarn's programme is to offer postgraduate education in chaplaincy studies in partnership with the relevant professional bodies:

- as continuing professional development at an advanced level for individuals engaged in chaplaincy work
- for candidates for chaplaincy ministries who have already studied theology to degree level
- for individuals wishing to pursue chaplaincy studies at postgraduate level.

St Padarn's Chaplaincy Studies programme is a unique development that supports in-service chaplains in their practice and ministry. A substantial placement module undertaken within students' workplaces aligns our programme to professional accreditation criteria.

### **An Expert Teaching Team with Excellent Feedback**

**Revd Dr Julian Raffay** is Director of Chaplaincy Studies at St Padarn's (and a St Padarn's graduate). He has worked extensively in mental health chaplaincy, including as Research Chaplain. He is pursuing doctoral research in the leadership styles adopted by British Army chaplains.

**Rev Dr Glynn Jones** completed his DMin (Chester) on models of chaplaincy in 2020. He is licensed as Chaplain to Chaplains in the Diocese of Carlisle and a former Regional Director of the Daylight Christian Prison Trust. He has extensive experience as Managing Chaplain HM Prison Haverigg and was formerly a Prison Officer.

**Revd Professor Jeremy Duff** is Principal at St Padarn's Institute. He has a passion for formation and mission. Jeremy's specialisms are in New Testament Studies and Leadership Development. He has an extensive publication list. He was previously the vicar of a deprived urban community near Liverpool.

# A Course for Working Professionals

To meet the needs of working professionals, teaching is delivered in four intensive blocks each year. Residentials take place from Monday to Wednesday at our site in Cardiff where we enjoy an extensive library and well-equipped teaching rooms. Our en-suite accommodation is modern and purpose-built. Meals are freshly cooked onsite, and we cater for special dietary requirements.

You are welcome to worship alongside members of our theological college in our attractive chapel. In addition to our comfortable common room, you may wish to explore the nearby cathedral, shops, cafes, pubs, and riverside walks.

In the master's programme, students study three modules a year for two years, followed by a years' dissertation writing. In year three, students are encouraged to attend the residentials as members of our learning community and work on their dissertations with access to the library, teaching staff.

To obtain the MA Chaplaincy Studies, students must complete six taught modules and a 15,000-word dissertation.

## **Closing Date, Entry Criteria, and Application Process**
